- Text: Revelation 2:12-17
- Review:
 - What lessons did we learn from the church in Smyrna?
 - As Christians, we are called to suffer.
 - As Christians, we are called to witness.
 - Even if we die, we have nothing to fear, because Jesus has conquered <u>death.</u>
- Background on Pergamum
 - Was the center of <u>emperor worship</u> in this region
 - Was the first city in Asia Minor build a <u>temple</u> to a Roman ruler (Augustus)
 - Also a center of worship for many false Gods
- The Letter
 - v. 12What from the vision of Jesus in chapter one can you find in this letter?
 - Double edged sword
 - Symbolizes Word of God, used to execute judgment later in the book
 - What was Pergamum doing right?
 - Holding on to their faith, enduring persecution
 - Satan's throne: probably because this was center of imperial cult
 - Antipas, martyr for the faith
 - What has Pergamum done wrong?
 - holding to the teaching of "Balaam" and the "Nicolaitans"
 - Some holding strong like Smyrna, some compromising
 - What does that mean?
 - Numbers 22-25; 31:16: giving in to social pressures and committing sin

- Balaam: tried to curse Israel, didn't work, then let Israel to commit sexual immorality 24,000 died as a result (Numbers 25:9)
- What does Jesus threaten will happen to those who do not repent? What does that mean?
 - Fight against them with the sword of my mouth: receive same fate as Jesus' enemies (Revelation 19:15)
 - There is no compromising when it comes to following Jesus. We must overcome
- What do the hidden manna, white stone, and new name symbolize?
 - Same as vv. 7, 11: Eternal life
 - Manna: Bread from heaven, c. John 6:31-35
 - White Stone: Given to those who triumphed in games, Vote of acquittal, pass of admission to special occasions
 - New Name: Significance of New name in OT (Abram/ Jacob), Significance of knowing someone's name
 - 3:12: Same name: God's name, cf. Luke 10:22, John 17:6
 - Revelation 22:3-4
 - Read Revelation 19, making note of white, sword, name, feast/marriage supper
- What is meant by "let anyone who has ears to hear listen"?
 - Use in the OT by prophets, used by Jesus when telling parables, Mass and is designed to enlighten some and blind others
 - Message is designed to enlighten some and blind others.
- What lessons can we learn from this?
 - We can know Jesus <u>now</u>.
 - But we will not know him <u>fully</u> until he returns.
 - God tests us to help us see if our faith is genuine.
 - All those who believe will <u>conquer</u>.
 - All those who conquer will be <u>saved</u>.
